

THE SECRET TO THE CHRISTIAN LIFE

Like a child looking at an unusual piece of machinery, he asks, "How does it work?" Many have wondered this about the Christian life for years.

Jesus had a following of people and decided one day to share with them "how it works" following the Lord. It turned their world upside down. We commonly call this the Sermon on the Mount. It was Jesus laying the ground rules for anyone who would be His followers. Let's just say, he didn't pull any punches or hold back by any means. It is a straightforward address dealing with very sensitive and challenging subjects, such as: living blessed under persecution, witnessing, keeping pure and away from lust, dealing with unforgiveness, staying married, forgiving and living non-judgmental, loving your enemies... and more.

How does that work? Who can live this way, and if they do, how are they doing it?

Jesus didn't share this message to discourage everyone, or to weed out the wimps – nor did he raise the bar so high that no child of God could reach it. Scattered throughout his message, Jesus reveals the secret to the Christian life. **You must learn how to spend time alone with God and pray.** It isn't an option, or just a nice thing to do; prayer is essential to your soul's well-being.

Take note of Jesus' words:

Matthew 5:43-45

43 "You have heard that it was said, 'Love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' 44 But I tell you: Love your enemies and *pray* for those who persecute you, 45 that you may be sons of your Father in heaven. NIV

Matthew 6:5-8

5 "And when you *pray*, do not be like the hypocrites, for

they love to pray standing in the synagogues and on the street corners to be seen by men. I tell you the truth, they have received their reward in full. 6 But when you *pray*, go into your room, close the door and *pray* to your Father, who is unseen. Then your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you... 8 Do not be like them (hypocrites), for your Father knows what you need before you ask him. NIV

Matthew 6:9-13

9 "This, then, is how you should *pray*: "'Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, 10 your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as it is in heaven. 11 Give us today our daily bread. 12 Forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. 13 And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one.' NIV

Matthew 6:25; 33-34

25 "Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life... But **seek** first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. NIV

Matthew 7:7-12

7 "Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. 8 For everyone who asks receives; he who seeks finds; and to him who knocks, the door will be opened. 9 "Which of you, if his son asks for bread, will give him a stone? 10 Or if he asks for a fish, will give him a snake? 11 If you, then, though you are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give good gifts to those who ask him! NIV

Jesus' point: we can't do this on our own. Even Jesus took time to pray. We must also take time for God, and pray. It really works.

Invite a friend or a few friends for this special day. There will be no tailgate party this year, but we will still have a great service!


Come Join Us at Wednesday Prayer Meetings — 6:30pm! See you there!
