I found this note as I was going through some of my past journaling. It's about a year old. I think it explains the joy and the struggle of leading and establishing a prayer culture: Prayer meeting night is simultaneously the most refreshing service of the week and the most difficult day of the week for me.


- Praise the Lord for many new members being received this Sunday!




#### BLAKE & JENNA BOLERJACK IN CONCERT SUNDAY, NOV. 22<sup>ND</sup> AT 10:40AM
