DON'T FORGET

Tis the time for giving thanks! Such a simple phrase but often goes unsaid. The mother giving much of her day to her family, fixing meals, cleaning dishes, folding laundry and coloring yet another picture with her little one, seldom hears a "thank you." The faithful worker who shows up on time, does their job well, and puts in the extra effort to make sure people and projects are taken care of, yet leaves most Friday's without an acknowledged appreciation. The devotion of a heavenly Father, watching over our lives, providing resources and strength, and blessing us with "gifts from above," not because He has to but because He chooses to out of love. I wonder, how often does He wait, hoping we would notice the blessing was from Him? How often does He long for us to look up to Him with a grateful heart and whisper the words "Thank you"?

So why do we struggle to say words of appreciation? Maybe because gratitude is humbling. It reveals that our lives are better because of another. That we are not "selfmade" individuals. In reality, our lives have been blessed by many... we are the fruit of other's contributions and gifts. Giving thanks is important... for many reasons:

1. Giving Thanks – shows appreciation.

It reminds us to not take everything for granted. The sunny day, the care of a family member, the joy of a friendship, a healthy body, time together, and on and on it goes. These are gifts and should be received with appreciation.

- 2. Giving Thanks curbs greed. When thankful you find contentment. Your flesh may "want" things, but your heart says, I don't really "need" things. I am blessed, and I am content with what God allows me to have today.
- Giving Thanks controls complaining. Mark Twain says, "Don't complain and talk about all your Pastor Scott and Cindy

problems — 80 percent of people don't care; the other 20 percent will think you deserve them." There may be more truth to this than we want to admit!

4. Giving Thanks – promotes the positive. There is an old phrase I picked up years ago which says, "Beauty is all around for those who choose to see it." Another great saying comes from Hudson Taylor, Missionary to China. During an especially trying time in the work of the China Inland Mission, Taylor wrote to his wife, "We have twenty-five cents — and all the promises of God!" That's a great outlook!

Giving thanks is not something we learn once and move on, it is a lifetime endeavor. We must be mindful each day of the opportunities and make the extra effort to show appreciation for all the Father has given us. We are truly blessed. These blessings, however, are also to be shared. Abigail van Buren reminds us of this in her poem, "Prayer of Thanks."

Prayer of Thanks

"O, heavenly Father: We thank thee for food and remember the hungry.

We thank thee for health and remember the sick. We thank thee for friends and remember the friendless. We thank thee for freedom and remember the enslaved.

May these remembrances stir us to service, that thy gifts to us may be used for others. Amen."
