

# WORK OUT YOUR RELATIONSHIPS

Do you remember the elementary school playground at recess? Kids would quickly eat their lunch and then line up to go to recess outside. Freedom! It was the best part of a child's day: swings, basketball, monkey bars. That is... until someone sat in your swing first, or they ran faster than you to grab the basketball, or three kids jumped in line before you on the monkey bars. Then, the arguments began! Freedom could quickly turn into mayhem as tempers began to flare. Thankfully, teacherswere there to sort things out or provide directions to the principal's office. Working out differences, exercising patience, and being a peacemaker isn't easy, but it is required if we want good relationships.

Conflict is not anything new. In fact, the earth's first couple had two boys named Cain and Abel, and Cain became so angry at his brother that he actually took his life. Conflict can separate the best of friends, take down businesses with co-owners, disrupt churches, and divide husbands and wives, as well as parents and children. Conflict is inevitable in a world affected by the Fall of Humanity, but it doesn't have to dismantle our relationships.

One day, as the disciples and many others were listening to Jesus on a mountainside teaching, one of the disciples asked him, "Lord, teach us to pray." Luke records Jesus' words, "When you pray, say: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be Your name. Your kingdom come. Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us day by day our daily bread. **And forgive us our sins, for we also**  *forgive everyone who is indebted to us.* And do not lead us into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one" (Luke 11:2-4 NKJV).

This prayer was to be a daily prayer. Yes, daily. In the real world, each day may present a new trouble, new skirmish, or offense by you or to you. As we seek God's forgiveness by faith, the grace we receive in turn we are able to offer in forgiveness to others. It is a cause-and-effect situation. In simple terms, God wants our relationship with Him to mimic our relationship with people.

Remember what Jesus also shared, "Blessed are the peacemakers for they shall be the sons (and daughters) of God" (Matthew 5:9).
