## THE PROMISE KEEPER

Being a teenager in the 90s was awesome! We had the best fashion, the best music, and definitely the best TV shows. I always watched The Tonight Show with Jay Leno (I wasn't your typical teen!). One of my favorite bits was called "Jaywalking." Leno would walk around the streets of Los Angeles and ask seemingly simple questions to people who wanted their fifteen minutes of fame. The answers were always funny to me; I mean... how could people get the answers to these easy questions so wrong? With that being said, I want to ask you a question; what does the Easter season mean for you?

We can all agree that as Christ-followers, we have a basic understanding of what Easter represents. The new life we find in Jesus' resurrection (2 Cor. 5:17), the establishing of a new covenant (Luke 22:20), and the saving grace Jesus offers us (Romans 6:14) are all products of what was accomplished on the cross. One thing that I had never really thought about was how much Easter emphasizes the importance of God's promises. One of the earliest illustrations of this is found in Genesis – with Abraham leading the Israelites to the Promised Land.

This last week we started a new series in our youth group that really focuses on God's promise

of a savior. It was a promise that was finally fulfilled with Christ. We talked about how there are two sides to a promise: hope and despair. When a promise is made, we find hope in that. If the promise, however, is not fulfilled or does not come as soon as we wanted, we can find ourselves in despair. It's in the middle of hope and despair that we find God's blessings pouring out into our lives without us even noticing it sometimes.

It was a year ago that our lives were flipped upside down. Promises and guarantees were made and then changed; This lead to more promises and guarantees that were also changed. In this last year of unfulfilled promises, it is important for us to find comfort in the promises that God gives us. I want to challenge all of us in this Resurrection season to keep the hope of His promises, even in our times of despair. Find comfort in the comforter, peace in the peacemaker, and rest in the arms of Jesus.
