

What Are You Reading?

Every book has a story to tell. From "Once upon a time" to "How to" and the vast world in between. Each wants to share its information to the reader. The curious reader may engage enthusiastically, or casually peruse the pages to see if anything jumps out and grabs their attention. Books are still one of the best ways to learn... about anything. In fact, Amy Watson, in U.S. book industry - statistics & facts, shares that though the book industry has struggled due to the heavy use of the digital world, books still remain important to the American people. Her data reveals that book sales have improved in the last five years and unit sales are over 650 million dollars per year. She also shares that nearly two-thirds of adults prefer a "hand-held book" versus a digital read. At the same time though, audio books have soared and in 2019 reached over one billion in sales... yes, that was a billion!¹

But looking at the vast number of books we have – alongside the troubles of society we have – makes one wonder "Will another book really help?". Maybe it is time to go back to an "old Book," one that is tried and true. 
Wrapped Candy Needed:

Important Updates for the Annual Church Meetings, Conventions and **District Assembly 2021**

Annual Church Meeting

From Office District:

Because of the pandemic, the Board of General Superintendents has approved some temporary rulings regarding the Annual Church meeting. They are as follows:

 The church board, with the approval of the district superintendent, may vote to continue with the church officers that are currently in place. This would be the Local Church Board, the SDMI, NMI, and NYI leadership.

 You may meet electronically. Voting methods shall be approved by the Local Church Board. All communications and voting required may be carried out electronically.

*Southwest Church has adopted carrying its boards and leaders over for the 2021 year. However, we have one board member who has decided not to stay on this year, therefore, we need to elect one board member this year. There will be no elections for delegates, only an appointment of delegates to view the District Assembly at the TBD location.

Southwest Annual Church Election will take place Sunday, March 7, at the morning worship service at 10:40am. When you arrive, at the entry table all MEMBERS (those who have been received into membership to the Southwest Church, not simply attending), can pick up a ballot at the table, fill it out and place it in the offering box in the back of the sanctuary before or after the services. Appointed Tellers will then tally the ballots following the service. We will publish our year end reports and election results in the March 10th newsletter.

SDMI/NYI and NMI Conventions will be virtual (online viewing only) this year. More details will be given in the days ahead.

District Assembly 2021 May 2 5:00 PM - 8:00 PM

District Assembly will look a little different this year. It will be a "Hybrid Assembly." This means that there will be a central location where the business of the assembly will transpire. At the location will be Dr. David Graves, GS; Dr. Ron Blake, DS, Rev. Josh Robertson, district secretary, support staff, ordination candidates (and spouses) and their guests.

The service will then be streamed to different locations across the district. We are asking that pastors and delegates in those areas go to these locations (still to be determined). The different locations will be treated as an extension of the assembly. There will be a way for anyone at these sites to communicate with the main location when committee reports are presented as if we were all in one room.

Upon the recommendation of the General Superintendent, there will be no election of officers. The current officers will serve for one more year. However, delegates will still need to be present. We will be hearing from Dr. Graves and Dr. Blake, receiving reports, and having an ordination service.

***Please note - Dr. Blake, is approving the following plan for those churches who will NOT be having elections this year due to the pandemic: The church board, acting as the nominating committee, will appoint those eligible to be delegates to the assembly.
